

Call for papers – Paris, December 11 2023

The Banque de France is organizing a workshop on "Macroeconomic and Financial Implications of Commodity Market Fluctuations" in its headquarters in Paris, on December 11.

Background and Objective:

Following the war in Ukraine, commodity market issues have become focal points for policy makers. The objective of this workshop is to bring together researchers that work on the intersection of macro-financial economics and commodity markets.

We encourage submissions from academic researchers as well as researchers from central banks and other institutions.

- Supply chain disruptions linked to commodity shocks
- Financial stability and commodity price volatility
- Commodity derivative markets
